Recycle anything with a plug. Most items are free, including computer towers, laptops, tablets, phones, small appliances, household electronics, printers, fax machines, VCRs, CD players, etc.

There is a fee of \$20 per unit for TVs, monitors and appliances with freon (refrigerators, A/C, freezers, and dehumidifiers). Bring cash or check made out the vendor: RMG.

This event is open only to Salem residents and property owners. Bring ID or a tax bill.

Q—Can I bring Fluorescent Bulbs?

A—No! Bring items containing mercury, including thermostats and all types of fluorescent bulbs, to **Salem's Department of Public Works,**

5 Jefferson Ave, during regular City hours: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday: 8am-4pm; Thursday: 8am-7pm; Friday: 8am-noon.
